2024 Objectives of the GACC Board

As we wrap up the first quarter of 2024, I'd like to inform you of the GACC Board's Annual Objectives and how we hope to better serve you:

1. **Document our internal processes** - in order to provide more transparency to the community in how the GACC operates, and to facilitate knowledge-

sharing as we get new volunteers.

- 2. **Increase visibility of our committees' progress** ensuring the Community can see the good work performed by our volunteers on our many committees throughout the year.
- 3. **Be the hub for information** around the Greater Avenues Community increase communication methods in digital and print, and at our community meetings.
- 4. **Financially invest in community projects** give back to community projects via our grants program and other projects that have community impact.

We look forward to discussing these goals for our organization during our March 6th community meeting.

Also at our March meeting, we're diving into a big project in the Upper Avenues: a new pump station replacing the old North Bench pumphouse at 18th Avenue and Hilltop Road, just north of Morris Reservoir.

This isn't just any project—it's a collaborative effort involving SLC Public Utilities, SLC Public Lands, the 18th Avenue Trailhead Improvement Project, the Rocky Mountain Power Wildfire Mitigation Project, and the I-Street Bike Park Working Group.

Feeling dizzy with all these names? No worries! We'll have a team of city staff members at the meeting to clarify everything, from who's involved to how it affects you. Plus, they're all ears for your ideas on using the old pump station's space. So, come with your thoughts and get ready to dive deep! This is our chance to help decide the look and feel of the Hilltop Road parking area that leads to the bike park and Bonneville Shoreline Trails.

Avenues Community Improvement Grant Applications Available!

As you may know, the Greater Avenues Community Council raises funds for various purposes including the costs of the monthly newsletter, the GACC web page, the Avenues Street Fair web page, our State and IRS registrations, and other administrative costs. The GACC Bylaws and our mission statement indicate that available GACC funds be used for the betterment of our Community.

We are pleased to announce that the 2024 GACC budget includes \$3,000 for Community Improvement Grants. The Avenues Grants Committee was formed with the purpose of engaging the Avenues Community in the identification of and completion of projects to enhance life on the Greater Avenues. Our hope is that through the completion of projects that reinforce these missions, neighbors working together will enhance a sense of community, pride, safety, and joy for all Avenues Residents. We will begin accepting applications on 1 February. We will address applications as they arrive and will continue to accept applications until October 15 or until all grant funds have been awarded.

It is recommended that we replace our home or apartment furnace and A/C filters at least once every 90 days. This is a general rule. The factors that can shorten that time can alter if your HVACs are running more than usual. Also if you have cat(s) with a lot of dander or dog(s) that shed. High quality filters do a better job, but they need changing just as often as inexpensive filters. If your landlord doesn't change them out, then you need to, for your own safety, utility bill, and health.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

The build-up of plastic waste in the world has long been a concern - one only heightened by the discovery of persistent "microplastics" in our environment (see Wikipedia for a detailed description). Salt Lake City has a fine recycling program, but "recycle" is only the last "R" in the three 'R's of waste

"recycle" is only the last "R" in the three 'R's of waste reduction. Recycling requires energy to collect, transport, and process waste, so only

some of the initial cost invested to produce the waste material is recovered. The most effective way to keep plastics and other materials out of the waste stream is to "Reduce" how much of them one acquires. For example, buying a shampoo bar in a box, rather than a bottle of liquid, generates very little plastic waste; "Reusing" a refillable container to take shampoo to the shower eliminates some plastic waste; "Recycling" however, only salvages some of the waste stream to a downstream use.

As we seek to tread more lightly on the earth, keep the three R's in mind.



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Rattled by Rattlesnakes? by Hilary Jacobs

Have you ever heard a sound like castanets while walking in the Foothills?

There's a good chance it was a rattlesnake's cautionary tail!
The Great Basin rattler shown is the only one of seven Utah rattler species that lives in the SLC Foothills.



Rattlers are easy to identify. They have large triangular-shaped heads with heat-sensing pits located between their eyes and nostrils. And, of course, the rattle at the end of their tail, evolved to scare away danger. The loud buzz occurs when they flick their tail up to 90 times per second, twice the speed of a hovering hummingbird's wings!

Rattlesnakes are ambush predators, holding their rattle up to move quietly. They use thermal "vision", vibration detection, and sensitive smell to locate and strike prey, injecting venom through long, hollow fangs that swing forward when they bite.

To stay safe in rattlesnake country, remain alert. If you hear or see one, give it space and leave. These snakes want nothing to do with you, and will defensively strike only if they cannot escape or scare you away.

Rattlesnakes are protected in Utah, playing a vital role in predator-prey balance. They are, however, threatened by habitat loss, poaching and extermination campaigns.

If you meet a rattlesnake, always remain respectful, and consider how fortunate you are to glimpse this beautifully adapted reptile in its natural home.

Morris Reservoir Pumphouse 18th Avenue at Hilltop Rd.

The Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is designing a new pump station to replace the aging North Bench Pump Station near 18th Avenue and Hilltop Road.

The new station, to be located north of the Morris Reservoir, will enhance energy efficiency, reduce operational costs, and improve water distribution.

During construction, it is planned to maintain access to the Bonneville Shoreline Trail and I-Street Bike trails.

Construction is expected to start in late summer or fall of 2024. SLCDPU is coordinating with other local projects to minimize community impact. For inquiries, contact Chloe Morroni at slcdpuEngagement@slcgov.com or Sophie Frankenburg at sfrankenburg@logansimpson.com.

Salt Lake City Transportation Project Updates

Virginia Street Reconstruction - Virginia Street will be reconstructed from South Temple to 11th Avenue starting late spring or early summer. The work will replace the asphalt surface, add sidewalks on the west side, install uphill bike lanes, traffic calming elements, improved bus stops, and intersection safety improvements. GACC Committee Spotlight: CERT

CERT (short for **Community Emergency Response Team**) is a nationwide FEMA-supported program that trains volunteers to help their neighbors

in the event of a disaster that overwhelms local professional responders. Think of events such as a major earthquake, extensive urban wildfire, etc.

The Salt Lake City Fire Department runs CERT classes that cover home preparedness, disaster first aid and medical treatment, light search and rescue, and team organization.

The GACC's CERT Committee promotes emergency preparedness and encourages residents to get CERT trained, while coordinating with the Salt Lake City Office of Emergency Management, the Salt Lake Crossroads Amateur Radio club, and local churches.

In the past year GACC CERT co-organized a neighborhood emergency preparedness fair, ran an informational booth at the Avenues Street Fair, and conducted a CERT exercise at the Ensign Elementary school.
